



NOTES FROM THE MUSIC MINISTER

Embracing 1500 Years in Worship Music Tradition: Prayerful Penitence Practice in Lent

Both Jewish and Christian traditions celebrate seasons of repentance and self-examination. For United Methodists, Lent is one of these seasons. It begins on Ash Wednesday, extends to Easter Eve and comprises the forty days of Lent omitting Sundays. Lent is a time when joyful celebratory music is withheld, and reserved to break forth afresh on Easter morning.

In worship, the prayer focus is one of penitence from earliest times (500 A.D.). In the Twelfth Century, musical themes of Christian and Jewish origin were intermingled. In earliest Jewish music, elements of folksong impacted the spontaneous improvisation sung by a cantor, which was, then, repeated by the choir.

Earliest Christian music was chanted in unison, and the practice was to chant Scripture, not only Psalms. Even in those years, we have records of the practice that newer texts were set to the older (known) tunes. We see examples in our service song books: The United Methodist Hymnal (1989) and in The Faith We Sing (2001).

In either book, there is an abundance of examples. In the Hymnal, # 60, "I'll Praise My Maker While I've Breath" sets words of Isaac Watts, written in 1719 to a tune attributed to M. Greiter, dated 1525. In The Faith We Sing, #2001 combines a new text "We Sing to You, O God" published in 1993, with a well-known tune in print over one-hundred years earlier in *Hymns Ancient and Modern*, (1875).

While music affects the mood of the text, and texts affect the musical character in the singing, it is a unique partnership with more than a few dramatic connections. Think of the hymns we associate with Lent, such as "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross," "Were You There When They Crucified My Lord?" "O Sacred Head, Now Wounded."

Reading the text alone might bring a tune to mind, and hearing the tune alone might recall some of the text. The next step is to consider the text and tune together when a congregation sings in earnest. We experience the impact produced by work of a poet combined with the music which matches the meter of the poetry and experience the effect of a biblically-based text with music, expressing, during Lent, the anticipation of Passion Week.

Praise God! What a joy it is to minister to those in our own backyard!

Our local mission projects these past few months included the delivery of poinsettias to our home-bound members, a.k.a. Epworth's "Missing Angels", over 80 items of food collected on Souper Bowl Sunday, delivered to Ghent Area Ministry for those in need in the Norfolk area, and shoe boxes filled with small toiletries, notepads, and candies, etc., delivered on Valentine's day to our Missing Angels.

Although perhaps not vast in scope, these things are appreciated in a very big way. Several of our missing angels called and sent cards to express their appreciation for the poinsettias and valentine boxes and for the visits by those who delivered them. And how many are touched by the food which was donated on Souper Bowl Sunday and distributed by Ghent Area Ministry.

Giving gives back in so many ways!

Acts 20:35 reads: "In all this I have given you an example that by such work we must support the weak, remembering the words of the Lord Jesus, for he himself said, 'it is more blessed to give than to receive.'"

Our committee strives to be responsive to missions not only on the local level, but also on the international level, with projects such as UMCOR, an international mission of the United Methodist Church, and on the national level by supporting projects such as the Red Bird Mission in Kentucky, and the Society of St. Andrew. On the international level we will again support UMCOR by donating health kits during Annual Conference in June. On the national level we have supported Red Bird Mission by donating gently used toys and clothing at Christmas time and will again this year. We have also supported the Society of St. Andrew with monetary donations and gleaning efforts throughout the year – in fact on Giving Tuesday, December 3, 2013, a project we participated in, The General Board of Global Ministries reported a record setting 6.5 million dollars given to missions by United Methodists around the world in a 24 hour period. Our earmarked contribution to the Society of St. Andrew joined 11,000 others in giving 16,300 gifts through The Advance to mission and ministries. Now that is VAST!

Back to our own backyard we will again host an open house during the season of Lent beginning Ash Wednesday, March 5th, through Good Friday, April 18th, from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. This will be our third year hosting this event and we believe it is a wonderful way to let those who work and live nearby know that there is a place they may come to reflect and pray during the Lent season. Please consider volunteering to be a host for this event. A weekly or one time commitment is all we ask. These couple hours can be a special time for your own reflection and prayer.

As the year progresses more mission opportunities will be announced along with occasional congregational outings; Epworth Fun Days. So remember - keep your eyes and ears open!


